We are looking at job descriptions from another region for a position of **Administrative Assistant**, a position that would primarily maintain the communication dynamics of the region. The joy of putting our regional house in order, in particular in the necessity of communication, is that it overcomes any urgency about a story, of a burden to survive, to reveal our Sacred Story of thriving as an instrument of the Divine in our work and play together. The Board invites you to keep us Prayed-Up in this work.

Charles Fillmore identified UNITY as an Educational Movement. I affirm that this is a primary purpose of UNITY WORLD WIDE, our Northwest Region, and each of our Centers and Ministries. In light of this purpose I have enthusiastically agreed to facilitate our **Scholarship Committee**. I dearly love the function of Scholarship, the providing of opportunities to enhance each of our learning toward the creation of a world that is transforming for everyone. This year we received eleven (11) requests for scholarship assistance to SEE and LUT training. This is four times the requests of previous years. The desire to learn and serve the world through Unity Principles and Practices is apparent. I envision a purpose for our Region to support this desire to learn and teach in as many venues as we can imagine. This includes increasing the numbers of SEE and LUT and Ministerial Student scholarships. I envision that we continue to provide travel scholarships to outlying Centers and Churches

for attending our regional conferences and trainings. And I envision an active program to provide scholarships to our young people for attending regional camps and conferences. The enhancement of Educational opportunities and scholarship in our region is a value return for all the gifts that our region circulates in abundance for the purpose of transforming our world. I invite all of your ideas about this potential focus of purpose.

I also invite you to come and be a part of the Spring Conference, the Summer Retreat and the Fall Training. We have a theme that embraces all of these events. That theme is the **CALLING OF THE SACRED STORY**. I trust you all had a great Easter. Like Easter, conference is a month early this year, so we have a little less time than usual to prepare the fiscal year-end of 2/29/08. Here is the year-end information as it stands today. One item that was not included in the budget was the Uniteen expense. That is a line item in the new budget. Another line item that needs clarification is what looks like a shortfall for Crystal Mountain, when in fact we retained \$7,500 in seed money for this summer. However, we are grateful for the abundance of \$15,119 income that blessed us this year.

We are allowing time for discussion of the questions I received after we published the proposed budget in our previous newsletter. Thank you for those questions. We have summarized them and they will be key to good dialogue. If you want clarification on the proposed budget or the fiscal year information now, please feel free to contact me by phone or email.

It is our intention as a board to provide full disclosure and timely, accurate information. I will be available to answer questions at Menucha as well, and provide you with updated year-end information. I look forward to seeing you then.

February 28, 1924 - February 27, 2008



Hilda met Rev. Erma Wells at The Church of Truth in 1941 when she was first introduced to Truth principles. In 1945 she was hired as Rev. Wells' secretary and was part of the ministry of Unity Church of Truth for nearly 60 years. She was ordained as a Unity minister in 1993 and served as an Associate minister until her retirement in 2002. In her career, Hilda performed over 400 weddings, her most favorite ministerial activity; and is known for her poetry.

SEE Classes Online, Telebridge, Unity Village

Unity Institute keeps working to expand opportunities to take classes. **SEE classes** are offered on-line and by telephone. Unity's **on-line** courses include a forum for posting answers to questions and read feedback from instructors and other students. With the **Telebridge** option, students participate in scheduled discussions while doing assignments at their own pace. Unity Earth Care Northwest

Earth Care Declaration

We declare:

There is a standard for the practice of being human. We are called to be stewards of Earth.

There is an ethic for our relationship with Earth. All creation has one source and is connected as One.

We are called to act in harmony and respect with all creation. All voices are equally important and must be heard.

We declare our covenant with God to walk upon Earth for the greatest good of all creation.

The draft declaration was presented at the Northwest Regional Conference in May 2007. We are asking the region to adopt it at the 2008 regional conference, as amended.

Fruits of the Work – Earth Day Activities

Looking for ideas for celebrating Creation? Here is a sampling of what Unity churches in our region are doing for Earth Day.

Unity Church of Olympia, Washington

On Earth Day Sunday (April 20), the Unity youth will love the church grounds with gardening and bird care. And in early May they will learn how to make and care for a worm bin that will convert kitchen waste into compost for the church grounds.

Unity World Healing Center, Lake Oswego, Oregon

Lynne Brown, Director of Silent Unity, will speak on Earth Day Sunday and bless the new church property of two acres surrounding a colonial style home. After the blessing the whole congregation will prepare the property for moving in – clearing brush, planting new shrubs, mowing the lawn, and planting a tree as a symbol of the move.

Unity of Beaverton, Oregon

The Unity Social Consciousness in Action committee is sponsoring their second annual Earth Fair in conjunction with a special Earth Day Sunday service on April 20.

Unity Church of Truth, Spokane, Washington

The church is celebrating “Earth Month” as well as its 95th anniversary! Events include a cleanup of the church grounds, a Sunday Earth Day service with the Green Team, and a Wednesday evening program on “The Healing Power of Earth Energy.”

Unity Church of Bozeman, Montana

On Earth Day Sunday the congregation will set an altar of preciousness complete with prayer ribbons for the six directions. At the end of the service they will move outside, to tie the ribbons on trees and thank the wind for carrying their prayers, and to go to the stream that flows next to the church for a “Gathering of the Waters” ceremony.

More Fruits – Earth Care at Conference

On April 22 at the regional conference, several projects are lined up for those who want to celebrate Earth Day by being of service, including work on Menucha Retreat Center's labyrinth. Thank you to John Butler at **Unity of Corvallis** for organizing these projects.

After the regional conference, Unity Earth Care Northwest and earth care teams in the Portland area are gathering together to share ideas and celebrate their successes. The gathering is being held on Thursday, April 24, 7:30 pm at Unity World Healing Center in Lake Oswego, OR. All Unity green teams and others interested in “greening” their churches are invited to attend.

Move Into Filling Urgent Needs . . .

Establish a relationship with your local public first-response agencies so that those agencies become partners with your local Unity church. Help them to recognize your church community as a source of prayer and emotional support for them, as well as those to whom they are responding. The CRT sees this activity as a core mission of Compassionate Response

The Compassionate Response Team views our mission as a dynamic, expanding program that will shift and grow and find its voice through the activities of every church and every individual involved.

As part of the course, we received a manual with weekly homework assignments. The chapter on "Come-When-Called" reads, "Chances are he's figured out that you are in no position to make him come unless he's on leash." Duh! And yet, there is a wealth of wisdom here.

This became much clearer a few weeks later when I received a phone call from the bookkeeper of a financial aid agency where I volunteer. She pointed out, in language that pushed all my shame buttons, that I had made a mistake. "Just don't let it happen again," she growled. (Pun noticed later!)

As the bookkeeper expressed her concerns to me, a thought flashed across my mind, "I'M A VOLUNTEER. I DON'T HAVE TO COME." Yes, it was comic relief. It also broke the hypnotic spell I was under.

Actually I was grateful for the conversation. It was a wonderful mirror to me of some habits of mine that are not supportive of life. I saw remnants of an old belief system that still relies upon fear, guilt and shame as motivators.

In my pet dog manners course, I have learned the importance of positive motivation when I call my dogs. If I call in a fearful, reproachful way, I am more likely to be ignored. When I call joyfully and lovingly, my dog runs exuberantly to me!

Divine Love and Life always call to me with compassion, peace, confidence and joy. But I may not hear

because I am loudly saying disparaging things to myself. As with my dogs, I now pay greater attention to how I address myself and those closest to me. (Meanwhile, you can send your condolences to my poor, long-suffering husband!)

In my role as regional representative, my intention is to communicate compassion and encouragement to support our unity. I may not always get it "right," but may I always be teachable!

And may we all come-when-called by Spirit!
